Introductory Ancient Greek II

Course Goals

This course forms the second half of an intensive introduction to Classical Greek, in which you will continue to develop and master a foundational knowledge of Greek grammar, syntax, and vocabulary, as well as your ability to translate short passages of prose from Greek to English, and vice versa.

Assignments

Class participation: You are encouraged and expected to participate actively in the classroom. Participation marks will be based on: attendance, timeliness, preparation (bringing textbooks to class, assignments completed, vocabulary memorized, etc.), and readiness to respond when called upon.

Quizzes: During Weeks 1–11, eleven short vocabulary and grammar quizzes will be given on the last class of the week. The quiz with the lowest mark will be dropped from the calculation of your final grade for the class.

Translation and Grammar assignments: There will be two kinds of homework assigned during Weeks 1–12. For the Translation assignments, you will translate several sentences from English into Greek, and vice versa. The Grammar assignments will be shorter than the Translation assignments, and will include a variety of exercises. All homework will be due at the beginning of class. One Translation assignment and two Grammar assignments with the lowest marks will be dropped from the calculation of your final grade for the class.

Late assignments: Assignments turned in late or electronically cannot be accepted or graded.

In-class tests: There will be two in-class tests. The first, on February 13, will cover Sections 65–90, and the second, on April 1, will cover Sections 91–111; each test is worth 15% of your final grade for the class, for a total of 30%.

Missed quizzes, assignments, and tests: Tests, assignments, and quizzes may be excused (but not retaken or handed in late) only in cases of medical or personal emergencies, or for religious obligations. In all cases, proper documentation needs to be provided within one week in order for the instructor to excuse the absence. The weight of the missed quiz, assignment, or test will be added to the weight of the next such item on the schedule.

Final examination: The final exam will be held in conjunction with the other section of GRK 102 H1S during the exam period, April 9–30, at a date to be announced. The final exam is worth 35% of your final grade for the class.

Everyone is expected to purchase personal copies of the three required textbooks at the University of Toronto Bookstore. A separate Greek-English/English-Greek dictionary is not required for this class, since the textbook contains a vocabulary at the end, but may prove useful later if you plan to continue your study of the language.
